And because they did not think it worthwhile to acknowledge God, God delivered them over to a corrupt mind so that they do what is not right. Romans 1:28

Do you ever just want to shout, "What is in the world is going on with this world!?" The things that were once deemed right are now deemed wrong, and the wrong reasoned as right. It is not so much that it is anything new, it just seems to have intensified and multiplied at an unheard-of rate in recent times. But the existence of all kinds of corruption and its resulting doom have been with us for some time, e.g., see the message of Isaiah in Isaiah 5:18ff. Paul, the apostle, addressed the issue of sin run rampant as well in the beginning of his epistle to the Romans. The progression of such tumultuous sin has a natural, and unfortunately all too common, progression of repetition. It looks like this as described in the book of Romans:

- God clearly reveals Himself to people so that they might realize who He is (1:18-20)
- Sinful people, nevertheless, foolishly exchange adoration of God for obsession with His creation (1:21-25)
- Waywardness from God leads to disgraceful and disgusting acts that God at last allows them to engage and continue in, and to receive its ruinous consequences (1:26-32)
- God's righteous and just judgement falls on everyone who refuses to repent and turn to Him (2:1-16)

So, just how is the man or woman of God to respond to the torrent of rebellion, immorality, and waywardness that is surging all around?

- Know what the Lord Himself proclaims to be right and wrong. Study His word zealously. Pray to Him fervently. Listen to His Holy Spirit attentively. When we do this, we will be far less likely to replace His righteousness with our own self-seeking mores.
- Encourage others who are His disciples to do the same, and if you have the opportunity as a parent, pastor, teacher, or through some other avenue of leadership to teach them the righteousness of God, by all means do so.
- Be vigilant that what you say and teach correspond to the reality of your own actions. Paul speaks to that very issue to the Romans (2:1-11). That is not to say that we must have reached perfection before we can speak to God's righteousness, but that our normal way of life does not reflect the very actions that the Lord deems as sin.

The world will continue to do what the world does. Unrepentant sinners will continue to sin as long as they are unrepentant, and to receive sins' just rewards. Oh, how urgent it is to share with them the good news that leads to life, and as we do, to be certain to live our own lives according to the standards of the Holy and Almighty Lord, and not our own.

MISSIONS ON THE MOVE:

SALEM AVENUE BAPTIST FOOD PANTRY.

The Food Pantry at Salem Avenue Baptist Church works cooperatively with GRACE to help provide food and essentials for individuals and families in need.

GRACE provides vouchers for families on a first-come, first-serve basis at GRACE on the morning that the Food Pantry is open. Once the vouchers are given, the church has the food pantry for that day to call and find out how many families will be served that day. US Foods brings a truck to GRACE every week with produce to be used in the food orders that someone from Food Pantry picks up to be used. Perishables and other items are bought at Walmart to fill the food orders. The first client comes at 1:30 and then every 10 minutes until all the families are served.

Salem Avenue Baptist Church is responsible for the 2nd, 3rd and 5th Wednesdays and the 2nd Thursday of each month. Other churches that participate in food pantries during the month are First Baptist, Immanuel Lutheran, St. Patrick Catholic Church, First United Methodist, Redeemer Lutheran and Central Community Church of God.

Donations are always accepted for the food pantry. A list of items needed are in the church weekly bulletin or monthly newsletter.

The SAB Food Pantry is under the supervision of Charles & Kay Rauls, with the help of Joyce Knapp, Bill Bacon, Dottie Reno, Suzanne Phillips, Jaci Huebner and Trudy Matlock.
